UT SOUTHWESTERN FACULTY MEMBERS HONORED

DALLAS — March 1, 1996 — Four UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas faculty members were recognized recently for outstanding achievement in their fields.

Dr. Kenneth Altshuler, chairman of psychiatry, was named 1995 Professional of the Year by the Dallas Alliance for the Mentally Ill. The mental-health advocacy group honored Altshuler for his long struggle to improve care for the mentally ill. They cited his role in establishing Mental Health Connections, a cooperative treatment program of UT Southwestern's Department of Psychiatry and the Dallas Mental Health and Mental Retardation Center.

Altshuler, who holds the Stanton Sharp Distinguished Chair in Psychiatry at UT Southwestern, recently assumed the presidency of the American Board of Psychiatrists and Neurologists, which determines the criteria and certifies physicians as specialists in psychiatry or neurology.

A NorthSide Dallas resident, Altshuler earned his medical degree at the University of Buffalo School of Medicine.

Dr. Paul Bergstresser, chairman of dermatology, has been elected to the American Board of Dermatology. The primary purpose of the board, which has 12 directors, is to establish and maintain the specialty's standards of training, education and qualifications.

Bergstresser is holder of the J.B. Shelmire Professorship in Dermatology at UT Southwestern. A NorthSide Dallas resident, he earned his medical degree at Stanford University School of Medicine.

Dr. H. Jay Boulas is among a group of 1,682 surgeons worldwide who recently were named Fellows of the American College of Surgeons. Boulas, assistant professor of orthopaedic surgery, specializes in treatment of the hand and upper extremities.

A Park Cities resident, he earned his medical degree at UT Southwestern.
