DALLAS--Dr. Jere Mitchell, a well known heart researcher at The University of Texas (Southwestern) Medical School at Dallas, will spend a year as a visiting scientist at Oxford University in England.

Dr. Mitchell, who is director of the Pauline and Adolph Weinberger Laboratory for Cardiopulmonary Research at UTSMS, will be at the University Laboratory of Physiology studying the relationship of the nervous system to the heart. He and the Dallas laboratory are noted for work on the effects of exercise on dynamics of the heart.

A professor in the departments of internal medicine and physiology at UTSMS, Dr. Mitchell is a former Established Investigator for the American Heart Association.

Prior to assuming the role at Oxford, he will speak on "Left Ventricular Function During Exercise" at a Sept. 2-5 symposium on Physical Fitness and Coronary Heart Disease in Copenhagen; and will deliver a talk, "The Control of Left Ventricular Performance" at the Sixth World Congress of Cardiology Sept. 9 in London.

Dr. Mitchell's wife and three daughters will accompany him for the stay in England.
