DALLAS--Virologist Dr. S. Edward Sulkin of Dallas returned this week from a month-long trip abroad to participate in international scientific conferences in Hungary, England and Czechoslovakia.

Dr. Sulkin, professor and chairman of microbiology at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School, took part in the Second International Congress for Virology in Budapest, Hungary, and the International Colloquium on Virology at Bratislava, Czechoslovakia.

In England, he took part in a virus-cancer conference at Cambridge University. Dr. Sulkin has been serving for the past two years as a consultant on viruses to the National Cancer Institute, a division of the National Institutes of Health.

Dr. Sulkin also presented seminars at the London School of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene and at the Animal Virus Research Institute at Pirbright, Surrey, while in England.

A noted researcher, Dr. Sulkin has been recognized for his studies demonstrating the role of bats in sustaining and transmitting viral infections, particularly rabies and encephalitis.
