DALLAS--Dr. Charles F. Gregory, chairman of orthopedic surgery at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School, has been named a representative of the American Board of Medical Specialties on the Liaison Committee on Graduate Medical Education.

The new committee will develop policies under which various specialty educational programs may operate more efficiently in providing the public with highly qualified medical specialists. Emphasizing its role is the fact that nearly as many physicians currently are enrolled in post-graduate medical education as are in undergraduate study in medical schools, Dr. Gregory points out.

Joining in the liaison effort are the American Medical Association, the Association of American Medical Colleges, the American Board of Medical Specialties, the Council of Medical Specialty Societies and the American Hospital Association, plus representatives of government and the public.

Chairman of Southwestern's Division of Orthopedic Surgery since 1956, Dr. Gregory has been W.B. Carrell Scottish Rite Professor of Orthopedic Surgery since that chair was created in 1965. He is immediate past president of the American Orthopedic Association and was president of the American Board of Orthopedic Surgery from 1969 to 1971.
