The following faculty members of Southwestern Medical School of the University of Texas will participate in the meetings of the Federated Societies for Experimental Biology in New York City on April 14-18:

Dr. Andres Goth, Professor of Pharmacology and Chairman of that Department, will present a paper entitled: "Studies on the Mechanism of Action of Cortisone in Experimental Hypersensitivity."

"The Anemia of Uremia as Induced by Bilateral Nephrectomy of the Dog: Evidence for a Hemolytic Mechanism" will be discussed by Dr. E. E. Muirhead, Professor of Pathology and Chairman of that Department.

Dr. John H. Copenhaver, Jr., Assistant Professor of Pharmacology, will present "Studies on the Effect of Mercurial Diuretics on the Enzymes of the Kidney."

"Evidence that TSH in Dogs Produces an Early Increase of Thyroid Iodine from Plasma Forms Other Than Inorganic Iodide" will be read by Dr. John C. Vanatta, Assistant Professor of Physiology.

Dr. James Holman, Clinical Instructor in Pharmacology, will discuss "Studies on Histamine Liberation in the Human Skin and the Effect of Cortisone."

Dr. H. T. Tidwell, Professor of Biochemistry and Chairman of that Department, and Mrs. Mary Nagler, Instructor in Biochemistry, will present the following papers: "Effect of Methionine and Some Emulsifiers on Fat Absorption" and "Effect of Acetoacetate on Insulin Action."

"Skin Resistance Changes Following Stimulation of the Hypothalamus" will be discussed by Dr. Frank Harrison, Professor of Pathology.

During the week of April 14 Dr. S. Edward Sulkin, Professor of Bacteriology and Chairman of that Department, will visit Harvard Medical School and Children's Medical Center and will attend the annual meeting of the American

Association of Immunology in New York City.

Dr. Andrew B. Small, Clinical Associate Professor of Surgery, will attend the meeting of the American Cancer Society in Austin on April 15-16.

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
