\*\*\*\*\*"Gastric Carcinoma" will be presented by Gifford-Hill Visiting Professor Feb. 25.

DALLAS—"Gastric Carcinoma" will be the topic of the Gifford-Hill Lecture to be presented at Internal Medicine Grand Rounds at 11 a.m., Feb. 25, in the Richardson Lecture Hall (Room D1.502) at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas.

The lecture will be delivered by the Gifford-Hill Visiting Professor of Medicine, Dr. Philip Schein, assistant director for Clinical Research at the Vincent T. Lombardi Cancer Research Center in Washington, D.C. As visiting professor, he will be on campus for the week of Feb. 22-26.

Also on Feb. 25, Schein will present "Pharmacology of Nitrosoureas" at Hematology Conference at 8:30 a.m. in the Hematology Pathology Conference Room in Parkland Memorial Hospital.

Schein is associate member of the Georgetown University Graduate School and professor in the Departments of Medicine and Pharmacology at Georgetown University School of Medicine, where he has been on the faculty since 1971. He is also chief of the Division of Medical Oncology in the Department of Medicine there.

He has served as senior investigator and head of the Section of Clinical Pharmacology in the Medicine Branch of the National Cancer Institute.

A 1965 cum laude graduate of Upstate Medical Center in Syracuse, N.Y., Schein was chief resident in Medicine at Beth Israel Hospital in Boston. He took special training in pharmacology and in tropical medicine.

A member of numerous professional organizations, he serves on the Board of Directors of the American Society of Clinical Oncology. He is a consultant in oncology and chemotherapy at the Clinical Center of the National Cancer Institute and a member of the Scientific Advisory Committee of the American Cancer Society.

Schein has been a participant in the National Academy of Sciences' U.S.-China Symposium "Nitrosourea of Anticancer Agents" and in the academy's International Policy Approaches to Cancer Research. He now serves as a member of the French-American Agreement on Cancer Research, the Japan-American Agreement on Cancer Research and the Argentine-American Agreement on Cancer Research.

Schein received an honorary doctorate from the National University of Rosario, Argentina, in 1980 and was named a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow last year. He is listed in Who's Who in America.

The Gifford-Hill Visiting Professorship, which brings a distinguished medical scholar to the campus as visiting professor for one week each year, is made possible by a grant to the medical school's Department of Internal Medicine by the Gifford-Hill companies. The visiting professor takes part in hospital ward rounds, seminars and conferences with medical students, staff and faculty at the health science center.
