DALLAS -- Faculty members at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas recently received the following awards and honors.

Peter E. Lipsky, M.D., director of the Harold C. Simmons Arthritis Research Center, head of rheumatic diseases and professor of internal medicine and microbiology, has been elected president of the Clinical Immunology Society.

Willis C. Maddrey, M.D., vice-president for clinical affairs, has been elected president of the 70,000-member American College of Physicians. Maddrey takes office in 1992 and serves as president-elect until then.

Roger N. Rosenberg, M.D., professor and chairman of neurology and holder of the Abe "Brunky" Morris and William Zale Chair in Neurology, was installed as president of the American Academy of Neurology April 23 in Boston. The academy is the world's largest neurology group, with a membership of 11,000.

Alice L. Smith, M.D., professor of pathology, has received the Food and Drug Commissioner's Special Citation "for invaluable guidance in the review of premarket approval and applications for immunology devices and to the FDA and industry on tumor marker devices."

Ellen S. Vitetta, Ph.D., director of the Cancer Immunobiology Center and holder of the Scheryle Simmons Patigian Distinguished Chair in Cancer Immunobiology, has been selected the winner of the 1991 Excellence in Science Award for her pioneering research on immune cells that produce antibodies.
