Two medical scientists from the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas have been named Picker Scholars by the National Research Council.

Dr. George C. Curry and Dr. Robert W. Parkey were among 35 recipients of fellowships and grants announced this year for support of research and training in radiology and nuclear medicine.

Dr. Curry, who received his B.A. degree from The University of Texas in 1958 and his M.D. degree from UTSMS in 1962, will return from a leave of absence to continue his second year as a Picker scholar. He will investigate the splanchnic circulation after interruption of the superior mesenteric artery.

Dr. Parkey, who received his B.S. degree from The University of Texas in 1960 and his M.D. degree from Southwestern in 1965, is a first year Picker scholar and is an associate professor at Southwestern. He will investigate small computer processing of scintigram data.

The awards program, valued this year at nearly a half million dollars, is supported by the James Picker Foundation and administered by the Committee on Radiology of the Research Council's Division of Medical Sciences. The National Research Council is part of the National Academy of Sciences.
