Two members of the Faculty of the Department of Bacteriology at Southwestern Medical School of the University of Texas will participate in the annual meeting of the Society of American Bacteriologists in Boston on April 27-May 2. Professor Robert M. Pike will discuss "The Agglutination of Sensitized Human O Erythrocytes in Serum from Rheumatoid Arthritis Patients" and Assistant Professor Paul Donaldson will discuss "The Influence of Cortisone, Route of Inoculation and Age on Susceptibility of Mice to Coxsackie Viruses."

On April 29 Dr. Arthur Grollman, Professor of Experimental Medicine and Chairman of that Department, will discuss "The Use of Oral Fat Emulsions in Experimental and Clinical Medicine" at the Conference on Oral Fat Emulsions and Their Use in Medicine in New York City. Dr. H. C. Tidwell, Professor of Biochemistry and Chairman of that Department, will also attend this Conference, sponsored by the New York Academy of Science, and will then go on to Washington, D.C., to attend a hearing of the Federal Security Administration which relates to fat absorption.

Dr. E. E. Muirhead, Professor of Pathology and Chairman of that Department, will discuss "Hemolytic Anemia in Renal Insufficiency Due to Bilateral Nephrectomy" at the joint meeting of the South Central Region College of American Pathologists, the Texas Society of Pathologists, and the Houston Society of Pathologists at Houston on April 26.
