UT SOUTHWESTERN FACULTY PHYSICIANS HONORED

DALLAS — November 3, 1995 — Three professors at UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas have been recognized for outstanding work in their fields.

Joel Feiner, M.D., professor of psychiatry, was named outstanding mental-health professional by the Texas Alliance for the Mentally Ill, a statewide consumer advocacy and support group.

Feiner heads the clinical services at Mental Health Connections, a joint program of UT Southwestern and the Dallas County Mental Health and Mental Retardation Center.

He earned his medical degree at Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

Robert W. McKenna, M.D., executive vice chairman of pathology and the John H. Childers, M.D., Professor in Pathology, became president-elect of the American Society of Clinical Pathologists at the group's annual meeting Sept. 19. ASCP, with nearly 70,000 members, is the nation's primary provider of continuing education for pathologists and other laboratory personnel.

McKenna earned his medical degree at the University of Minnesota Medical School.

Marc C. Mumby, Ph.D., professor of pharmacology, has been selected to serve as chairman of the Biochemistry Study Section of the National Institutes of Health's Division of Research Grants. Members of the section review NIH grant applications and make research funding recommendations. Mumby's term runs through June 1997.

Mumby earned his doctorate at the University of California - Riverside.
