DALLAS--New gifts to The University of Texas System Eminent Scholars Program at the June UT Board of Regents meeting bring the total money designated for the UT Health Science Center at Dallas to \$5,355,906.84, the largest amount in the UT System for an individual institution. The total amount that has been received by the entire UT System, including gifts accepted June 13-14, is \$11,473,948.05.

The Texas State Eminent Scholars Program was established to encourage donations from the private sector to institutions of higher education for attracting and retaining eminent scholars to Texas. Gifts of \$50,000 or more are used as permanent endowments for academic positions. The income earned by these endowments is to be matched by funds from the general revenue fund on a biennial basis by the legislature. These funds are applied only to professorships and academic chairs for supplementing salaries or supporting research or other educational projects.

Gifts to UTHSCD accepted by the UT Regents in June included a gift of \$3,285 for the Robert W. Lackey Visiting Professorship and an addition of \$4,250 for the Robert L. Moore Professorship in Pediatrics. The Lackey Professorship totals \$64,357.35 with the addition, and the Moore Professorship totals \$449,205.65 with the addition.

Total for other UT schools in the Eminent Scholars Program include the following amounts: UT Permian Basin, \$90,000; UT San Antonio, \$500,000; UT Tyler, \$250,000; UT Medical Branch at Galveston, \$2,607,000; UT Health Science Center at Houston, \$416,666; UT Health Science Center at San Antonio, \$319,669.61. The UT System Cancer Center has \$1,834,705.60 in Eminent Scholars Program gifts, and the UT System itself has \$100,000.
